Course Overview

Start your rewarding career in disability with All Health Training and become a job-ready Disability Support worker.

This qualification is designed for individuals working in community, home, or residential care settings. They operate within a multi-disciplinary team, under supervision and delegation. Their primary role is to deliver personalised support to individuals who may need assistance due to factors such as aging, disability, or other reasons.

Some tasks may include: personal care, mobility support, meal preparation, household tasks, emotional support, transportation, implementing care plans, behavioural support, advocacy and community engagement.

Entry Requirements

This course is an open entry program of study and to succeed, students should have basic reading, writing, and communication skills necessary for the job. Competency is assessed through a combination of practical application and demonstration of skills, research, analysis and completion of competency based workbooks.

Practical Experience and Assessment

Students get the opportunity to undertake practical skill development throughout the course in the All Health Training simulated environment with trainers who are experts in their field and maintain currency in the industry. Students are also assessed based on skill development throughout the course.

Credit Transfers (CT) + Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

If students have already successfully completed unit/s of competency which are included within the current listing qualification AHT offers, credit transfers may be granted. Credit transfers must be approved prior to course commencement. Competencies gained through other formal study or experience may be acknowledged through a recognition process of prior learning (RPL).
